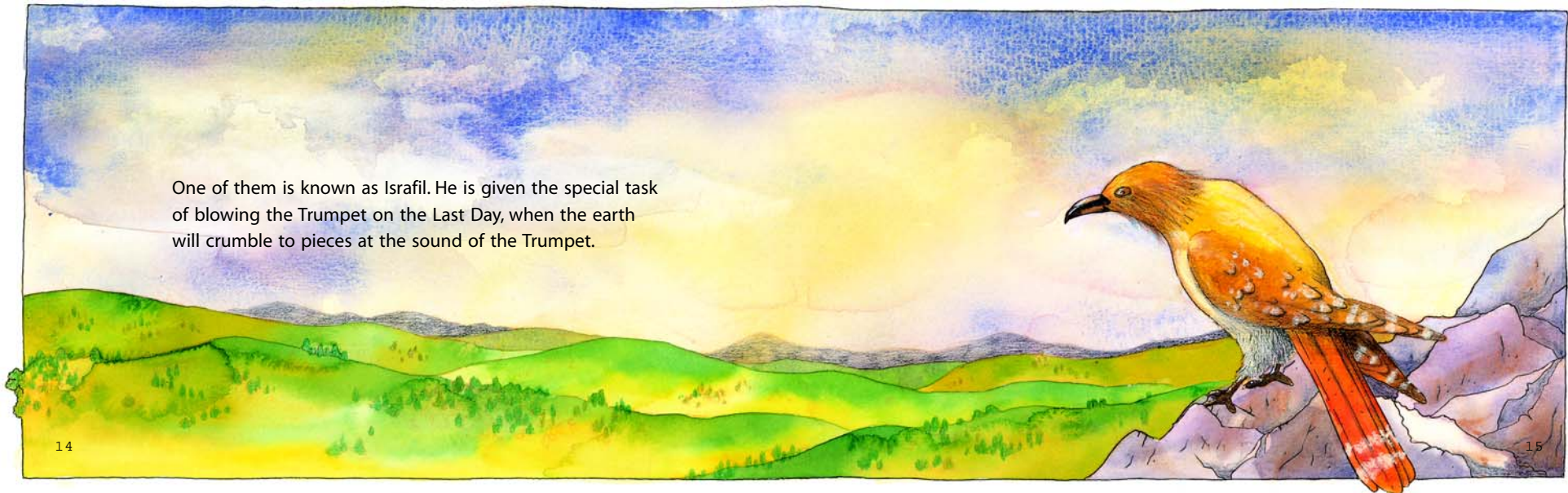
Other important angels

brings down the rain.



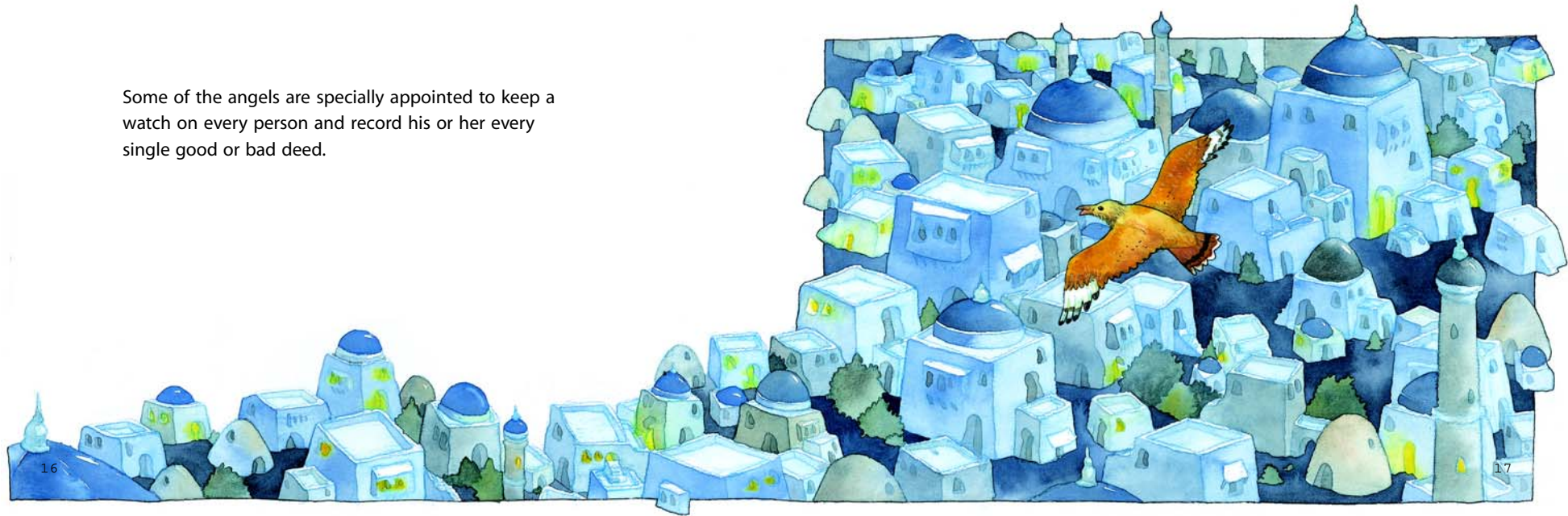


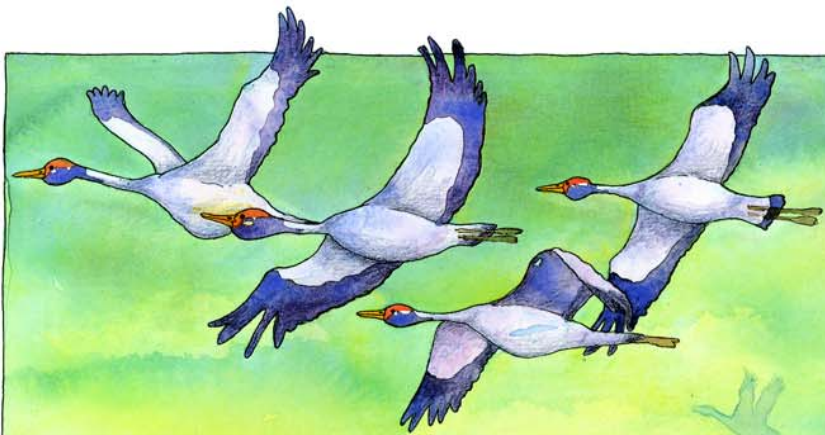
The angel Izrail or Azrael is given the task of carrying off human souls. He is also called *Malak al-Mawt*, or the Angel of Death.

Some of the angels are specially appointed to keep a watch on every person and record his or her every single good or bad deed.

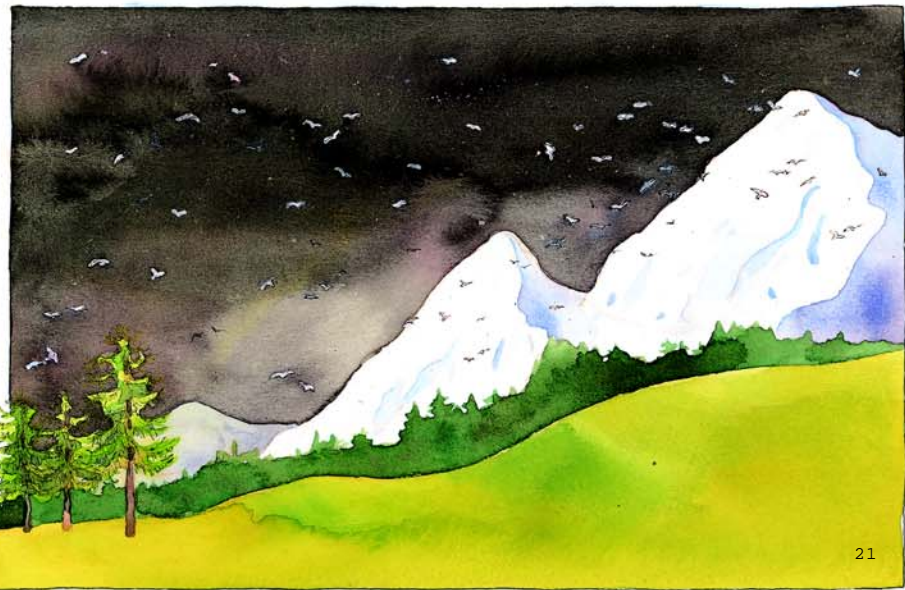

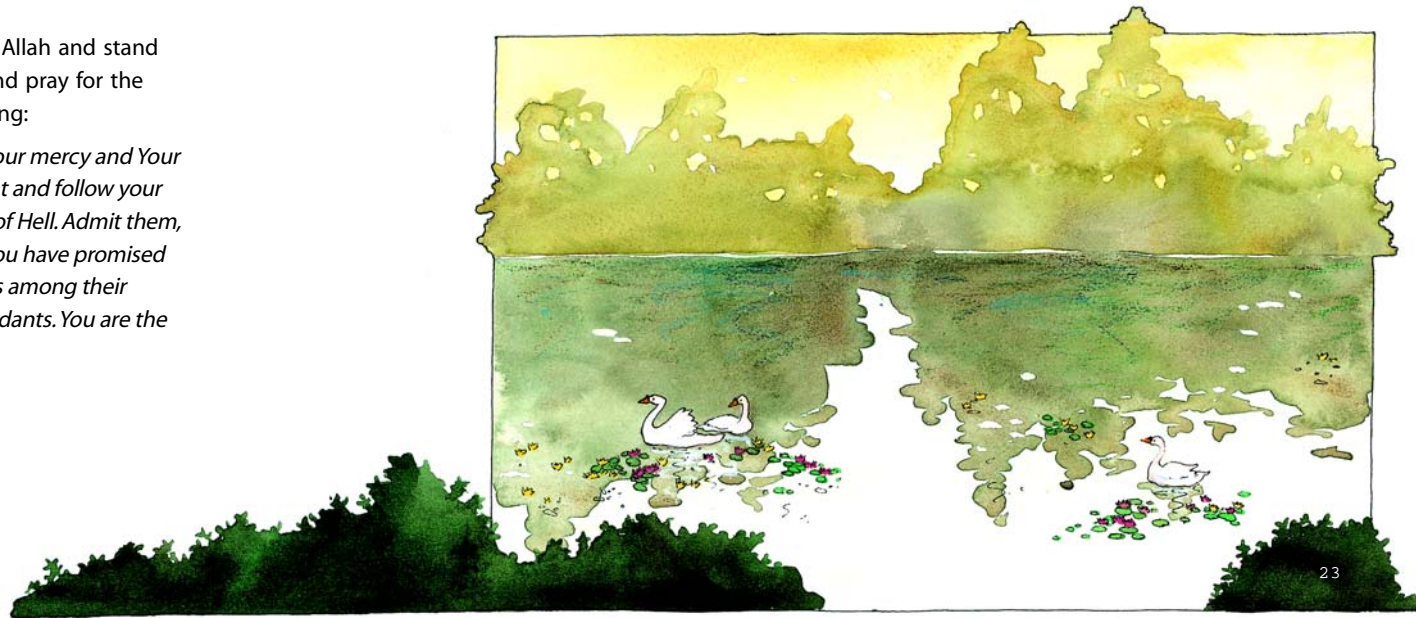


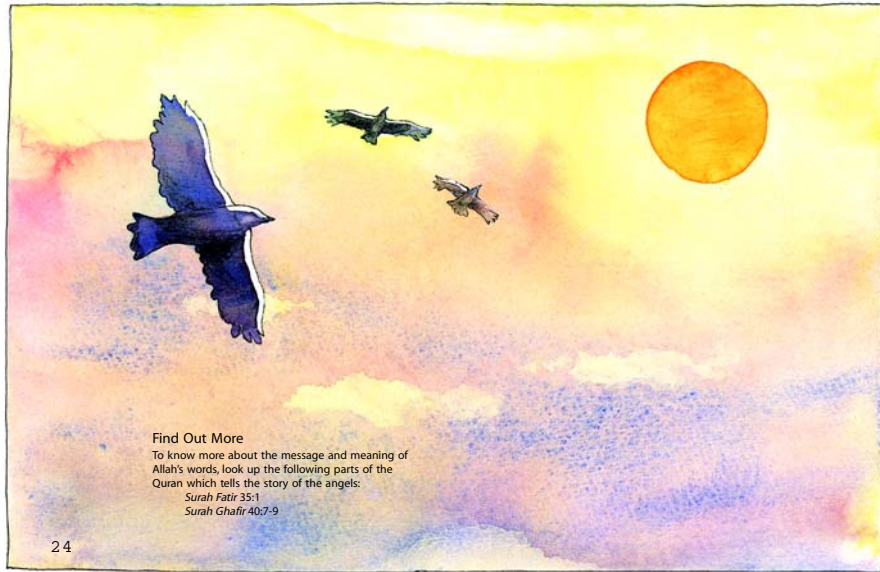
On the Night of Power, or *Laylat al-Qadr*, which is one of the special nights of Ramadan, the angels come down on earth in greater numbers.
