Our month concluded with the distribution of the interim progress reports and we will start off the month with parent teacher interviews. You should have received Interim Progress Reports from our teachers on Monday. This is not an official report card; however, its purpose is to provide a snapshot of how your child is doing thus far. Our teachers will be conducting in-person interviews with all of you this Friday, with some exceptions.

Sugar-Free November: We ask that all parents comply with this initiative and not send any sugary treats or snacks during November. In fact, I am hoping that parents join us in this challenge and embrace this initiative in their homes. The teachers, administration, and of course the principal, will also give up sugar in November.

Travel during the year. I am also noticing many requests to travel overseas during the school year. Please understand that the school discourages students from missing school for any extended period, even if the work is taken and completed during the trip. The government does not support us for 'distance learning.' If your children travel, they will be given the basic workbooks, but the report card will reflect the student(s) absence and minimal assessment. I do empathize and understand the need for families to travel, but the government does not make allowances and penalizes us for long-term absences.

Social media and online activity. I would like all of you to be very careful with your children's online activity and screen time at home. We parents are allowing our children to connect with other students, and family members via social media, unsupervised. It may seem harmless, but we are learning about many problems involving profanity, inappropriate discussions between boys and girls, and cyberbullying as well. While we do our best to control these issues in school, we cannot control what the students do on their devices in their homes. That is the responsibility of all parents. Ultimately, parents need to check, monitor, and guide their children when they use Discord, Snapchat, You Tube, Online Gaming, Instagram, Tik Tok, and more.

Perhaps we've assumed that prayer is just a thing that us Muslims do and that it should sprout up naturally and in an agreeable manner within our homes, but that may not the case. Creating a family prayer plan can provide structure to help a family achieve its prayer-related goals, mitigate conflict, maintain a peaceful home life, and build love and connection within a family. Can you all agree that everyone in the family will do their best to pray all five prayers every day on time? Since that's the core of a daily prayer regiment required as a religious obligation, this goal is essential. Perhaps one individual in the family needs support in praying regularly, whether it is through learning or habit-building. This meeting could be an opportunity for the individual and the family to collaboratively work together to think of solutions in a positive way to help that person improve their daily prayer habits.


Label Belongings

Why Does Attendance Matter?

Every school day counts in a child's academic life...

We would like to kindly remind all students, parents and guardians that **school starts at 8:00 A.M.**, and our morning Duaa will begin few minutes after that Insha'Allah. One of the best ways of making the most of your child's educational experience as well as the blessings of group morning Duaa is to ensure they arrive to school on time Insha'Allah.

A missed school day is a lost opportunity for students to learn. In this era of increased accountability for states, districts, and schools, the connection between student attendance and learning is being studied more than ever before. As a result, education agencies are asked with increasing frequency to report attendance data in a standard manner to allow comparisons across organizations and jurisdictions.

The primary rationale for high-quality attendance data is the relationship between student attendance and student achievement. Teacher effectiveness is the strongest school-related determinant of student success, but chronic student absence reduces even the best teacher's ability to provide learning opportunities. Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve at higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance. This relationship between attendance and achievement may appear early in a child's school career. A recent study looking at young children found that absenteeism in kindergarten was associated with negative first grade outcomes such as greater absenteeism in subsequent years and lower achievement in reading, math, and general knowledge.
