
Insha'Allah, I look forward to welcoming all of our students back in the new year.

Established by the Canadian Government in 2007, Islamic Heritage Month provides an opportunity to learn and honor the rich history of Islam, and contributions of Muslims in Canada. It is important to recognize the diversity that exists within the faith of Islam, and the folks who practice it including the multitude of people, stories, and cultures that have shaped, and continue to shape Canada.

We are incredibly excited to announce an exceptional event honoring Islamic Heritage Month, hosted by the BC Muslim School on December 11th, 2022, from 1:30 PM to 4:00 PM in the School's Gymnasium Insha'Allah. Throughout the month of November, there is incredible joined effort from both the Homeroom and Core teachers to take our students in an explorative, and informative learning journey of knowledge that blends scientific discoveries, technological advancements and the richness of Islamic History. Students will demonstrate what they have learned by displaying the projects they have made as groups. On December 11th, an exhibit of our student's projects will be on Display, with live presentations from our talented students Insha'Allah.

Teachers have catered to the learning level of each of their students to teach them about several historical Muslim discoveries and inventions in a variety of fields, such as Space and Astronomy, Structures and Architecture, Islamic Art, Flight, Medicine, and Education. with people they trust.


Instead of rushing to solve problems, give kids time to work things out themselves.

Why Does Attendance Matter?

Every school day counts in a child's academic life...

We would like to kindly remind all students, parents and guardians that **school starts at 8:00 A.M.**, and our morning Duaa will begin few minutes after that Insha'Allah. One of the best ways of making the most of your child's educational experience as well as the blessings of group morning Duaa is to ensure they arrive to school on time Insha'Allah.

A missed school day is a lost opportunity for students to learn. In this era of increased accountability for states, districts, and schools, the connection between student attendance and learning is being studied more than ever before. As a result, education agencies are asked with increasing frequency to report attendance data in a standard manner to allow comparisons across organizations and jurisdictions.

The primary rationale for high-quality attendance data is the relationship between student attendance and student achievement. Teacher effectiveness is the strongest school-related determinant of student success, but chronic student absence reduces even the best teacher's ability to provide learning opportunities. Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve at higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance. This relationship between attendance and achievement may appear early in a child's school career. A recent study looking at young children found that absenteeism in kindergarten was associated with negative first grade outcomes such as greater absenteeism in subsequent years and lower achievement in reading, math, and general knowledge.
